# **Dallas Museum of Art**

dma.org 1717 North Harwood Street

Located in the Dallas Arts District, the Dallas Museum of Art houses an impressive collection, ranging from impressionist paintings to contemporary sculpture. The Wendy and Emery Reves Collection includes a replica of the Villa La Pausa, as well as furnishings, masterpieces, and decorative art. Director Max Anderson PhD '81 is a Harvard alumnus.

# **Nasher Sculpture Center**

The Nasher Sculpture Center features the world-renowned contemporary sculpture collection of Raymond HLS '49 and Patsy Nasher. Located in the Dallas Arts District, next door to the Dallas Museum of Art, the center presents rotating exhibitions in indoor and outdoor spaces, including a building designed by architect Renzo Piano (who also designed the newly renovated Harvard Art Museums) and a garden designed by landscape architect Peter Walker MLA '57. Director Jeremy Strick GSAS '86 is a Harvard alumnus.

## Klyde Warren Park

Located across from the Nasher Sculpture Center and the Dallas Museum of Art, Klyde Warren Park is a beautiful 5.2-acre public park that connects the vibrant Uptown neighborhood with the Dallas Arts District and downtown Dallas.

#### **Perot Museum of Nature and Science**

The Perot Museum of Nature and Science, opened in 2012, is a magnificent natural history and science museum located near Klyde Warren Park. Director Colleen Walker MBA '00 is a Harvard alumna.

### George W. Bush Presidential Center

Located on the beautiful campus of Southern Methodist University, the George W. Bush Presidential Center is home to the Bush Presidential Library and Museum and the Bush Institute.

### **Meadows Museum**

The Meadows Museum houses one of the largest and most comprehensive collections of Spanish art outside of Spain. The museum, which has an affiliation with the Prado in Madrid, is located on the campus of Southern Methodist University.

### **Dallas Arboretum and Botanical Garden**

Located just east of downtown Dallas, the Dallas Arboretum and Botanical Garden is a 66-acre urban oasis that delivers breathtaking color for visitors throughout the seasons. It includes the Rory Meyers Children's Adventure Garden, an eight-acre garden created to provide an innovative place for preschool through middle school children to learn about the life and earth sciences.

## **Highland Park Village**

Constructed in 1931, Highland Park Village is America's first shopping center. This unique Mediterranean/Spanish-style development offers a unified architectural style as well as luxury shops and fine dining.

#### **Kimbell Art Museum**

The Kimbell Art Museum is internationally renowned for both its collections and its architecture. The museum's main building, designed by American architect Louis I. Kahn, is widely regarded as one of the outstanding architectural achievements of the modern era. A second building, designed by architect Renzo Piano and opened in November 2013, provides space for special exhibitions.

### **Amon Carter Museum of American Art**

The Amon Carter Museum of American Art was founded to house Amon Carter's remarkable collection of paintings and sculptures by Frederick Remington and Charles M. Russell. Today, the museum has over 300,000 objects, including paintings, sculptures, and prints, as well as one of the finest collections of American photographs.

## **Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth**

Located near the Kimbell Art Museum and the Amon Carter Museum of American Art, the Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth is dedicated to collecting, presenting, and interpreting international developments in post–World War II art in all media.
