

HARVARD STUDY LEADER



James (Jim) Engell has taught at Harvard since 1978, chairing the Department of English from 2004 to 2010. The recipient of four faculty-wide teaching and advising awards, Engell offers courses in General Education (on rhetoric and on the Enlightenment), romantic poetry, 18th-century studies, and environmental issues. He has also taught different courses with colleagues in the Department of Economics and the Divinity School.

Engell began his studies leaning toward science, a path he continues today as a faculty associate of the Harvard University Center for the Environment. He has taught environmental seminars at Harvard, the National Humanities Center, and for a consortium of nine North American and Asian Universities, including Harvard. A Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, he served as president of the Association of Literary Scholars, Critics, and Writers and belongs to the Cambridge Scientific Club.

LONG WALK TO FREEDOM

Step back in time to the most pivotal moments in South Africa's anti-apartheid movement and Nelson Mandela's "long walk to freedom" with inspiring visits that reveal the historic, 20th-century milestones that culminated in the inauguration of South Africa's first black president and stimulated the most progressive economic, social, political, and educational prosperity the country has seen.

In Rivonia, tour Liliesleaf Farm, a key meeting place for members of the African National Congress (ANC) and the liberation movement in the early 1960s. Specially arranged guest speaker Nicholas Wolpe will discuss his role as founder and CEO of the Liliesleaf Farm Trust. Follow in Mandela's footsteps through Soweto, and stand at the Union Buildings in Pretoria, site of Mandela's historic 1994 inauguration following South Africa's first multiracial democratic general election. And, explore UNESCO World Heritage-designated Robben Island, the isolated former outpost for political prisoners off the coast of Cape Town.


RESILIENT DIVERSITY

TUESDAY AND WEDNESDAY,
FEBRUARY 27 AND 28

U.S. / JOHANNESBURG, SOUTH AFRICA

Depart on an overnight flight and arrive the following day in Johannesburg. This charismatic city is home to one of the world's largest urban forests, where more than six million trees flourish in the subtropical highland climate. Upon arrival, check in to the five-star FAIRLAWNS BOUTIQUE HOTEL.

THURSDAY, MARCH 1

JOHANNESBURG / SOWETO

Few places reflect South Africa's history like Johannesburg's South Western Townships, better known as Soweto. No longer a shantytown, this thriving community, pivotal in the anti-apartheid movement, endures as a broad cross section of South African daily life—from shack settlements to a rising middle class to millionaires. Its Vilakazi Street even fostered two Nobel Peace Prize laureates, Nelson Mandela and Desmond Tutu.

Commence your journey in the footsteps of Mandela in Soweto. Visit Mandela's house and the Hector Pieterse Memorial, an iconic symbol of the historic 1976 apartheid protests. Tour the evocative exhibits in Johannesburg's Apartheid Museum, and visit Liliesleaf Farm—once the epicenter of the liberation movement and today a museum and world-famous cultural heritage site.

Enjoy the welcome reception in the hotel this evening. (B,L,R)

FRIDAY, MARCH 2

JOHANNESBURG / PRETORIA

North of Johannesburg is the vibrant capital city of Pretoria, known for its diverse architecture, purple-blossomed jacaranda trees, and distinctly Afrikaans culture.

See the Union Buildings and the formal garden where Mandela gave his historic presidential inauguration speech (1994). Visit the Voortrekker Monument, built to honor the mid-19th-century Dutch Voortrekkers (pioneers), who emigrated from the Cape Colony to the inland highveld.

Enjoy dinner with special guest speaker Nicholas Wolpe, founder and CEO of the Liliesleaf Farm Trust. (B,L,D)

SATURDAY, MARCH 3

JOHANNESBURG / MALAMALA GAME RESERVE

After breakfast, fly to Skukuza and drive to MalaMala Game Reserve, an extension of Kruger National Park, to check into MALAMALA MAIN CAMP.

Later, embark on your first game drive into the African bush, followed by dinner in the lodge. (B,D)

SUNDAY, MARCH 4

MALAMALA

Renowned particularly for the quality of its leopard viewing, MalaMala is South Africa's largest private "Big Five" game reserve, nestled between the Sabi Sands Game Reserve and Kruger National Park. This land is a sanctuary for nearly 150 species of mammals, more than 500 bird species, over 100 varieties of reptiles, dozens of fish and amphibian species, and nearly 350 types of trees. Enjoy morning and afternoon game drives to observe wildlife roaming freely between the reserves and seeking refreshment along the Sand River. (B,L,D)

MONDAY, MARCH 5

MALAMALA / CAPE TOWN

After your morning game drive in MalaMala, fly to Cape Town. Check in to the historic BELMONT MOUNT NELSON HOTEL. The remainder of the day is at leisure. (B)

TUESDAY, MARCH 6

CAPE TOWN / ROBBER ISLAND

Cape Town today is a cosmopolitan capital city of well-preserved Edwardian and Victorian buildings and outstanding examples of Cape Dutch architecture. Ascend Table Mountain by cable car (weather permitting) for sweeping city and coastal views. See the historic City Hall, where Mandela made his first public speech just hours after his release from prison.

Tour Robben Island prison, a UNESCO World Heritage site, where Mandela and other political prisoners made strides in attaining equal rights during apartheid. Its history provides perspective on South Africa's social and political transformation. (B)

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 7

CAPE TOWN

Visit Boulders Beach in Simon's Town for an up-close look at a protected colony of endangered African penguins. After lunch, drive into Table Mountain National Park for a panoramic tour of the UNESCO World Heritage Cape Floral Region, home to over 4,000 plant species, and ride a funicular to lofty Cape Point.

In a private home in Cape Town's Bo-Kaap township, savor the spices of Cape Malay cuisine—a fusion of South African, Dutch, and Malaysian flavors—during a specially arranged *C'est Bon! CULINARY TRADITIONS™* dinner. (B,L,D)


THURSDAY, MARCH 8

CAPE TOWN

Experience the extraordinary Cape Winelands along the world-renowned Stellenbosch Wine Route. During a visit to the historic Vergelegen Cape Dutch Manor House, enjoy a private tasting of the region's signature pinotage red wine. Then enjoy a specially arranged lunch with wine pairings at Boschendal, one of the oldest wine estates in South Africa. (B,L)

FRIDAY, MARCH 9

CAPE TOWN / KASANE, BOTSWANA / CHOBE RIVER, NAMIBIA

This morning, fly to Kasane, Botswana, for entry into Namibia. Board the ZAMBEZI QUEEN for a world-class small river ship experience. From your "floating lodge," local guides will lead you on game-viewing river safaris aboard private excursion boats. (B,D)

SATURDAY AND SUNDAY, MARCH 10 AND 11

CHOBE RIVER

Visit a Namibian village along the river to experience local culture firsthand, including a dance performance and artisan crafts. Join local guides on small excursion boats for game viewing, fishing, or bird watching. (2B,2L,2D)

MONDAY, MARCH 12

CHOBE RIVER / CHOBE NATIONAL PARK, BOTSWANA / VICTORIA FALLS, ZIMBABWE

Disembark the ship this morning and transfer to Botswana's Chobe National Park. Enjoy a morning game drive among one of the densest Kalahari elephant populations (approximately 120,000) on the continent, as well as lions, cheetahs, leopards, zebras, impalas, hyenas, wildebeests, warthogs, hippopotamuses, crocodiles, water buffaloes, and more than 450 bird species.

After lunch in a local restaurant, transfer to THE VICTORIA FALLS HOTEL for an evening at leisure. (B,L)

TUESDAY, MARCH 13

VICTORIA FALLS

Walk the trail along the edge of thundering Victoria Falls, a UNESCO World Heritage site, one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World and among the largest waterfalls on earth. Here, the Zambezi River plummets into a 355-foot gorge, vaulting a fine mist high into the air, lending this cascade its local name, *Mosi-oa-Tunya*—"the smoke that thunders." See the impressive Victoria Falls Bridge, an engineering marvel that was designed and constructed in England, then transported to and assembled at the Zambezi River gorge. This is the only rail link between Zambia and Zimbabwe.

Enjoy the farewell dinner in the hotel. (B,D)

WEDNESDAY AND THURSDAY, MARCH 14 AND 15

VICTORIA FALLS / JOHANNESBURG, SOUTH AFRICA / U.S.

Check out of the hotel and continue on the Botswana's Khwai River Lodge Post-Program Option or fly to Johannesburg for your return flight to the U.S.

Arrive in the U.S. the next day. (B)
