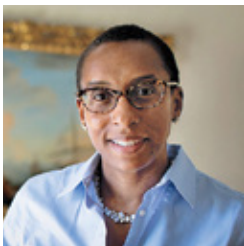


FAS 101

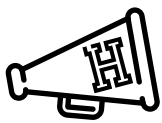
