Crossroads of Cultures

The fortunes and histories of the Canary Islands, Northern Africa, and the Iberian Peninsula have been intertwined for centuries. On a thrilling two-week voyage aboard the intimate Sea Spirit, sail from the Canaries to Madeira and onwards to Morocco, Spain, and Portugal.

Begin on the Canary island of Tenerife to stroll its UNESCO-listed historic guarter. Sail Sea Spirit to Gran Canaria, Columbus' last stop before departing for the New World, to view his namesake church. On nearby Lanzarote, marvel at artist César Manrique's transformation of an entire island into his canvas. Step ashore in Portuguese Madeira to savor a sip of its eponymous wine.

In Morocco, explore the opulent mosques and excellent museums of Marrakesh, Casablanca, and Rabat. A highlight in Marrakesh will be a special tour of superb art collections in a rarely visited former palace. Sail through the famous Strait to discover a vast underground fortress in Gibraltar, and travel to Spain for an exploration of the ancient city of Cádiz. Alternatively in Seville, discover the world's largest Gothic cathedral and the ornate Alcázar. This culturally enriching voyage will conclude in Portugal's gorgeous and historic Algarve.

We will travel in the company of members of The Metropolitan Museum of Art, The National Trust for Historic Preservation, and alumni of Yale, University of Chicago, and Vanderbilt. Reserve your place on this trip with confidence: Your deposit will be fully refundable until 120 days before departure. An optional one-night postlude is available in colorful Lisbon.

A LITTLE MORE TO IT

This trip's active components include walking over cobblestone streets, a visit to a volcanic park, and tours of historic buildings that may involve climbing stairs. Comfortable walking shoes are essential! In April, temperatures across this region should be in the 60s, 70s, and 80s °F-and sunny. However, we suggest that you bring a raincoat or umbrella, hat, sunblock, insect repellent, and warmer layers for evenings when the temperatures drop. On occasion, a more conservative dress and demeanor are essential to your visits to Islamic cultural sites of Morocco.

FRIDAY, APRIL 22

Departure

Depart on an overnight flight to Tenerife.

SATURDAY, APRIL 23

Tenerife, Canary Islands, Spain

Arrive in Tenerife, and transfer to the Hotel Botánico to enjoy a buffet lunch. Next, choose to explore the nearby Botanical Garden or spend a relaxing afternoon at the hotel. Later, gather at the hotel for a garden reception with cocktails followed by a welcome dinner.

SUNDAY, APRIL 24

Tenerife / Embark Sea Spirit

Drive to the UNESCO-designated Teide
National Park and enjoy a picnic lunch.
Or opt for a full-day tour along the
cobblestone streets of La Orotava. Admire
its 17th-century heritage buildings and
the Church of Our Lady of Conception,
a Baroque architectural masterpiece.
Following lunch, tour the UNESCO-listed
historic quarter of La Laguna, known for
its well-preserved mansions, town hall, and
cathedral. Before boarding the awaiting
Sea Spirit, view the opera house designed
by Santiago Calatrava.

MONDAY, APRIL 25

Las Palmas de Gran Canaria

Devote the day to the capital city of Las Palmas de Gran Canaria, Columbus's last stop before leaving for the Americas. On an architectural tour of the Old Town, see Teatro Pérez Galdós, an exceptionally beautiful concert hall, on a private visit. Explore the Christopher Columbus Church and House Museum, the 19th-century Town Hall, and the landmark cathedral. After welcome remarks from a town official, enjoy refreshments and lunch at Gabinete Literario, a 19th-century neoclassical building. The captain's welcome reception and dinner are on board tonight.

TUESDAY, APRIL 26

Arrecife

On Lanzarote, an island known for its volcanic terrain, step ashore this morning in Arrecife. Visit legendary artist and activist César Manrique's landscape projects, home, and extensive art collection at the César Manrique Foundation, built on an old lava flow. Then attend a musical performance at Los Jameos del Agua, a series of lava caves containing an artists' workshop and gallery. At Timanfaya's El Diablo Restaurant, watch as chefs prepare your lunch using heat from a volcano. In the afternoon, continue to the volcanic park of Timanfaya, a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve. This evening, return to the ship and cruise to the port of Funchal. B,L,D

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 27

At Sea

Attend lectures and enjoy the amenities of Sea Spirit as she crosses dazzling waters to Madeira. B,L,D

THURSDAY, APRIL 28

Funchal, Madeira, Portugal

On a morning walking tour, discover the narrow streets of Funchal's Old Town and the Mercado dos Lavradores (farmers' market), featuring Madeira's freshest fruits,

vegetables, and flowers. Explore the gardens of Quinta do Palheiro Ferreiro, with their variety of plants growing among beautiful hills. In the afternoon, tour the Sacred Art Museum of Funchal. Before departing, enjoy a tasting of Madeira's eponymous wine. B,L,D

FRIDAY, APRIL 29

At Sea

Relax aboard Sea Spirit as she sails east to Morocco. You may wish to enjoy a special screening of Casablanca in the lounge. B,L,D

SATURDAY, APRIL 30

Safi, Morocco / Marrakesh

From Safi, travel east to Marrakesh. Marvel at the Kutubiyya mosque in the medina, the old walled section of town, and take a special tour of the rarely visited Dar El Bacha, the former home of the last pasha of Marrakesh and now a museum. Later, stroll in the colorful Majorelle Garden at Yves Saint Laurent's former home. Tour the YSL Museum and the famous Djemaa el-Fna Square before boarding the ship for Casablanca.

Enjoy an optional, exclusive overnight stay in Marrakesh with a private jet flight to Casablanca and visit to Rabat. View the Marrakesh Jet-Set Excursion for more details.

SUNDAY, MAY 1

Casablanca / Rabat

Arrive this morning in Casablanca, and continue to the dramatic Hassan II Mosque. Drive to Rabat for a visit to the new Mohammed VI Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art or the Archaeological Museum. Later explore the Kasbah des Oudaïas, in the oldest part of the city, with sweeping views of the ocean, before returning to the ship.

MONDAY, MAY 2

Gibraltar, United Kingdom

Be on deck during lunch as the ship passes through the Strait of Gibraltar. Visit Saint Michael's Cave within the nature reserve, home to Gibraltar's famed tailless monkeys, the Barbary macaques. Also, within the Rock, visit the World War II tunnels, a vast underground fortress built by British royal engineers during the conflict. Tonight, Sea Spirit sails to Spain B,L,D

Antonio and the evocative Slaves' Market. Before returning to the ship, explore the award-winning Museu de Portimão, a stunning museum housed in a former 19th-century sardine canning factory. B,L,D

THURSDAY, MAY 5

Lisbon / Disembark

Disembark early this morning, and transfer to the airport for flights home.



Algarve Coast, Portugal

TUESDAY, MAY 3

Cádiz, Spain / Seville

Ashore in Cádiz, you can opt to explore this ancient city, stopping to view its 18th-century cathedral and other highlights. Marvel at Francisco Goya's frescoes in the Oratorio de la Santa Cueva. In the afternoon, drive to Jerez de la Frontera to try sherry and meet the Marquis at the 13th-century Palacio del Virrey Laserna. Alternatively, travel to Seville. Visit the UNESCO-recognized Gothic cathedral and view Giralda Tower. Continue to the Alcázar, the longtime palace of the Spanish kings, and the nearby Murillo Garden. After lunch, visit La Casa de Pilatos, a 15th-century palace. This evening, return to the ship.

WEDNESDAY, MAY 4

Portimão, Portugal / Sagres / Lagos

Disembark in Portimão, and drive to Sagres, home of Prince Henry the Navigator and his famous school of navigation. Following lunch, continue to Lagos, the last port from which the *caravelas* set off for their voyages. Visit the Church of San

Optional Marrakesh Jet-Set Excursion

APRIL 30-MAY 1, 2022

Enjoy a special overnight alternative excursion in Marrakesh, featuring a more leisurely exploration of its stunning sites and an amazing private jet ride over Morocco's gorgeous terrain. Delight in an exclusive tour of Marrakesh's magical Villa Oasis, the ornately decorated estate of Yves Saint Laurent. Stay overnight at the five-star La Mamounia Hotel, and wake up to fly in private style to Casablanca to visit the Hassan II Mosque. Continue to Rabat to tour the Mohammed VI Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art or the Archaeological Museum. Return to the ship in Casablanca.

During your time in Lisbon, visit historic Belém Tower, the Jerónimos Monastery, and the Tile Museum in the Madre de Deus Convent, renowned for its blue-and-white glazed panels. Spend the evening exploring the Alfama Quarter, Lisbon's oldest neighborhood. Accommodations for one night are at the Four Seasons Ritz Hotel, Lisbon.

Ship Details

Built in 1991, the intimate Sea Spirit underwent a total refurbishment of passenger accommodations in 2017. Her 58 suites range in size from 215 to 463 square feet. Guests enjoy single seating in the restaurant, a well-stocked library, and generous outdoor deck space. There are two multipurpose lounges for educational programs and entertainment. The ship has an elevator, a hot tub, and a well-equipped gym, but it does not have a hair salon or spa.



Contract: Harvard Alumni Association does not itself conduct tours, but instead partners with several different tour operators to offer a broad range of travel programs. Tour participants contract directly with tour operators, although HAA is available to act as a liaison with tour operators should participants have any questions or concerns. HAA is not responsible for performing any of the tour operator's obligations. The tour operator for this program is Arrangements Abroad, based in New York, NY.

Program Cost Inclusions: One night's accommodations at the Hotel Botánico; eleven nights cabin accommodations aboard *Sea Spirit*; meals as indicated in the itinerary (B=Breakfast, L=Lunch, R=Reception, D=Dinner); Bottled water, soft drinks, juices, and coffee/tea with all meals; thoughtfully selected wine at welcome and farewell dinners; airport/hotel/pier/airport group transfers for all participants on suggested flights; enrichment program of lectures and talks; escorted sightseeing by private motorcoach; entrance fees for included visits; customary shipboard gratuities; taxes, service, and porterage charges; gratuities to local guides and drivers.

Program Cost Exclusions: International airfare; passport/visa fees; meals not specified; alcoholic beverages other than as noted in inclusions; personal items and expenses; airport transfers other than for those on suggested flights; baggage in excess of one suitcase; trip

insurance; optional Marrakesh Jet-Set Excursion; optional Lisbon postlude; any other items not specifically mentioned as included.

Program Size Sea Spirit can accommodate up to 100 passengers for this voyage. Harvard passengers will be joined by guests from the cosponsoring institutions of The Metropolitan Museum of Art, National Trust for Historic Preservation and the alumni associations of Brown, Vanderbilt and the University of Chicago, as well as potential independent travelers.

Reservations, Deposits & Final Payment: To reserve a space on this program, a \$1,000 deposit is required per person. Reservations are acknowledged in order of receipt until the maximum enrollment has been reached. Final payment is due December 23, 2021 (120 days before departure) by cash, check (payable to "Arrangements Abroad"), wire transfer, ACH, debit card, or American Express credit card. Participants will receive an invoice directly from Arrangements Abroad for all subsequent payments after the initial deposit.

Participant Cancellations & Refunds: Notification of cancellation must be received in writing by HAA from the participant. No deposit refunds will be given for cancellations received after December 23, 2021. Subsequent payments are subject to the cancellation penalties as follows: 120 to 91 days prior to departure: 20% of the Program cost is non-refundable. 90 to 61 days before departure: 50% of the Program cost is non-refundable. 60 days or less before departure: 100% of the Program cost is non-refundable. No refunds will be given for cancellations on or after the day of departure, or for unused portions of the tour, for any reason.

Trip Insurance: Neither HAA nor the tour operator, including all representatives, employees, and agents, will take responsibility for any costs or losses incurred or suffered by a participant, or a participant's dependents or traveling companions before, during or after the tour. This includes, without limitation, cancellation or curtailment of the tour, emergency evacuation expenses, medical expenses, repatriation expenses, or damage/theft/loss of personal baggage, money, and goods. As noted below, neither HAA nor its tour operators shall be liable for any airline cancellation penalty incurred by the purchase of a nonrefundable airline ticket or for any other expenses incurred by tour participants in preparing for the tour.

HAA highly recommends the purchase of trip insurance to cover unforeseen trip interruptions, cancellations, lost baggage, and emergency medical assistance and evacuation. Participants may purchase trip insurance through any provider. HAA will provide information from one provider, Redpoint Resolutions, upon confirmation, which will detail available options. If a participant purchases a trip insurance policy from Redpoint Resolutions within a 14-day window, then the pre-existing medical conditions exclusion will

be waived, and the participant will be eligible to purchase the "Cancel for Any Reason" upgrade. The 14-day window begins on the first day the participant's trip deposits become non-refundable. For participants who utilize a trip credit to book the trip, the 14-day window starts the first day the participant is subject to financial penalty for cancellation, including full or partial loss of the trip credit. An insurance policy, when issued, shall constitute a contract only between the participant and the insurance provider. HAA will not intervene in any transactional issues or claim disputes between the participant and the insurance provider.

Air Arrangements International airfare is not included in the cost of the program. The tour operator can assist you with your air arrangements. Neither the Harvard Alumni Association nor the tour operator accepts the liability for any airline cancellation penalty incurred by the purchase of a non-refundable airline ticket. The air ticket when issued shall constitute the sole contract between the passenger and the airline concerned. Airfare is subject to change and availability and is nonrefundable. Your airline ticket constitutes a contract between you and the airline, even if purchased through Operator.

What to Expect/Physical Health: Due to the prevalence of SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19), participants should anticipate rules and restrictions to be enforced at airports, on flights, and at country entry points, as well as protocols in place during the program to reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission. Updates will be provided closer to departure.

All participants must be in overall good health to participate in a HAA trip. All programs require physical independence and mobility: participants must be able to embark or disembark all conveyances used on the program alone or with minimal assistance from a traveling companion and must be able to climb stairs and step over raised thresholds without assistance.

Participants requiring assistance **must** travel with a companion who will be responsible for handling any required equipment. Any physical or mental health condition that may require special medical attention or physical assistance must be disclosed in writing prior to booking so that HAA and the tour operator may evaluate whether participation is feasible. All participants should consult with their doctor about whether they can meet the physical requirements of their trip and must complete and return any medical forms required by the tour operator.

Participants with **dietary restrictions** also must make these known to the tour operator well before departure, otherwise the tour operator may not be able to accommodate them.

Preparing For The Tour: Participants will be provided with comprehensive pre-departure travel information, including specific suggestions for packing.

Terms & Conditions (continued)

Changes in Itinerary, Program, Staffing & Costs: The itinerary is subject to change at the discretion of HAA and the tour operator. HAA reserves the right to change program dates, staff (including study leader), itineraries, or accommodations as conditions warrant. HAA further reserves the right to cancel programs, levy a small group surcharge, send a program without a study leader, and/or withdraw HAA sponsorship from a program. Please note that all participants are bound to the cancellation fee schedule and other terms and conditions of the program regardless of whether HAA takes any of these actions. Participants making deviations from the scheduled itinerary do so at their own expense. All prices quoted are based on prevailing fuel prices, airfares, and currency exchange rates in effect as of the date of this publication and are subject to change.

Failure to Operate the Tour or Cancellation of the Tour by the Tour Operator: If the tour operator fails to operate the tour or cancels the tour, except as a direct result of adverse weather conditions, strikes, local laws, hostilities, wars, terrorist acts, significant health concerns (such as epidemics or pandemics requiring significant travel disruptions), or other such causes beyond HAA and the tour operator's reasonable control (Force Majeure Events), then the tour operator shall refund all monies received from tour participants. If the tour operator's failure to operate the tour or cancellation of the tour is a direct result of a Force Majeure Event, then the tour operator may provide participants a refund consisting, in whole or in part, of a credit toward future travel. Tours also shall be canceled if the U.S. State Department, another U.S. government agency, or a relevant local government agency issues a statement within sixty (60) days of tour departure to the effect that American citizens or others should not travel except for essential reasons to any of the destinations on the itinerary for that tour. In such case, the tour operator will provide an alternate tour with a revised or substitute itinerary and may provide tour participants who choose not to travel on the alternate itinerary a refund consisting, in whole or in part, of credit toward future travel.

Curtailment of the Tour by the Tour Operator: If a tour is curtailed after it has begun, either as a direct result of a Force Majeure Event or because the U.S. State Department, another U.S. government agency, or a relevant local government agency has issued a statement to the effect that American citizens or others should not travel except for essential reasons to the remaining destinations on the itinerary for that tour, then the tour operator will take immediate steps to end the tour early and assist tour passengers with travel arrangements back to their homes or other final destinations. In such a case, the tour operator may provide tour participants a refund for the number of missed days on

the original tour consisting, in whole or in part, of credit toward future travel. The calculation for any such refund shall consider any non-recoverable prepayments, and any additional expenses incurred by the tour operator to wind up the tour early.

Responsibility: The tour operator, its owners, and employees act only as agents for the various independent suppliers and contractors providing transportation, hotel accommodations, restaurants, and other services connected with this tour.
