

Spend two nights in the five-star Hotel Schweizerhof Lucerne, ideally located on the shores of Lake Lucerne. Cruise aboard the exclusively chartered. deluxe Amadeus Imperial, one of the finest boats to ply the waters of Europe, from Amsterdam to Basel. Port calls in Germany include Cologne, Cochem, and Mannheim for Heidelberg—a highlight of historical "Grand Tours" of Europe. Also visit the lovely Alsatian city of Strasbourg, France.

Christie McDonald is the Smith Research Professor of French Language and Literature in the Department of Romance Languages

and Literatures and Research Professor of Comparative Literature at Harvard University. From 2000-2006, she served as Chair of the Department of Romance Languages and Literatures. She and her husband, Michael Rosengarten, were faculty deans of Mather House at Harvard from 2010 to 2017. A literary historian, as well as cultural critic and theorist, Recently, she is the author The Life and Art of Anne Eisner: An American Artist between Cultures (2020) as well as a major chapter on 18th century French women writers (1715-1793) in the French publication Femmes, littérature. Une histoire Culturelle (Gallimard, 2020). As co-editor she has published Proust and the Arts (2015), Rousseau and Freedom (2010), and French Global: A New Approach to French Literary History (2010). Among other honors, McDonald is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada and was named Commandeur in the French Palmes Académiques. She divides her time between Cambridge, Massachusetts, and northern Vermont.

FRIDAY, JULY 7

Zermatt/Lucerne

SATURDAY, JULY 8

Lucerne

Begin your walking tour in the Weinmarkt and

the Chapel Bridge, then see the Lion Monument. dedicated to the Swiss Guards who gave their lives during the French Revolution. Reach Mount Pilatus' 7.000-foot summit by panoramic gondola for a 360-degree vista. **Board the Pilatus Railway** to ascend nearly 5.400 feet in less than three miles. Cruise across the lake to Lucerne.


THE GOLDEN AGE OF AMSTERDAM PRE-PROGRAM OPTION

During your tour of Edam, enjoy lunch at the L'Augerge Damhotel Restaurant. Accommodations are for two nights in a deluxe hotel.
















The elegant and meticulously crafted Amadeus Imperial features all the comforts of a refined and traditional hotel. The 84 stylish staterooms and suites are among the most spacious of any European river ship (172 to 284 square feet). Suites include a private balcony, and select staterooms feature a unique floor-to-ceiling window that lowers to French-balcony height at the touch of a button. Accommodations have two twin beds or one queen bed, individual climate control, sitting area, and private bathroom with shower; most have a minibar.

The delightful restaurant offers scenic views through panoramic windows as well as continental cuisine featuring fresh, local ingredients. Daily meals include early-risers' coffee, buffet breakfast and lunch, afternoon tea, four-course dinner with complimentary wine and beer, and late-evening snack.

For your leisure time on board there are two bars, an open-air lounge, complimentary Wi-Fi (conditions permitting), beauty salon, boutique, massage room, fitness studio and Sun Deck. An elevator serves all passenger decks except the Sun Deck. There is no doctor on board.

The Amadeus fleet has been earned the important "Green Globe Certificate" of environmental sustainability.
