Michael McCormick. Born on the banks of the Erie Canal, McCormick received his PhD from the Université Catholique de Louvain in Belgium

and served in academic appointments at Johns Hopkins University and Dumbarton Oaks before coming to Harvard in 1991. He is presently the Francis Goelet Professor of Medieval History and chairs the new University-wide Initiative for the Science of the Human Past at Harvard (SoHP), an interdisciplinary research networks that brings together geneticists, archaeological scientists, climatologists, environmental, computer and information scientists, humanists, and social to explore great questions of human history from our origins in Africa to our migrations across the globe. Author of numerous monographs and articles and recipient of several fellowships, McCormick has also chaired the FAS Standing Committees on Archaeology and on Medieval Studies. Harvard College undergraduates and alumni prize his dedication to lively teaching inspired by pioneering research.

# Petra/Wadi Rum/ Embark Ship/Aqaba

Check out of the hotel and traverse the wilderness of UNESCO World Heritage-designated


