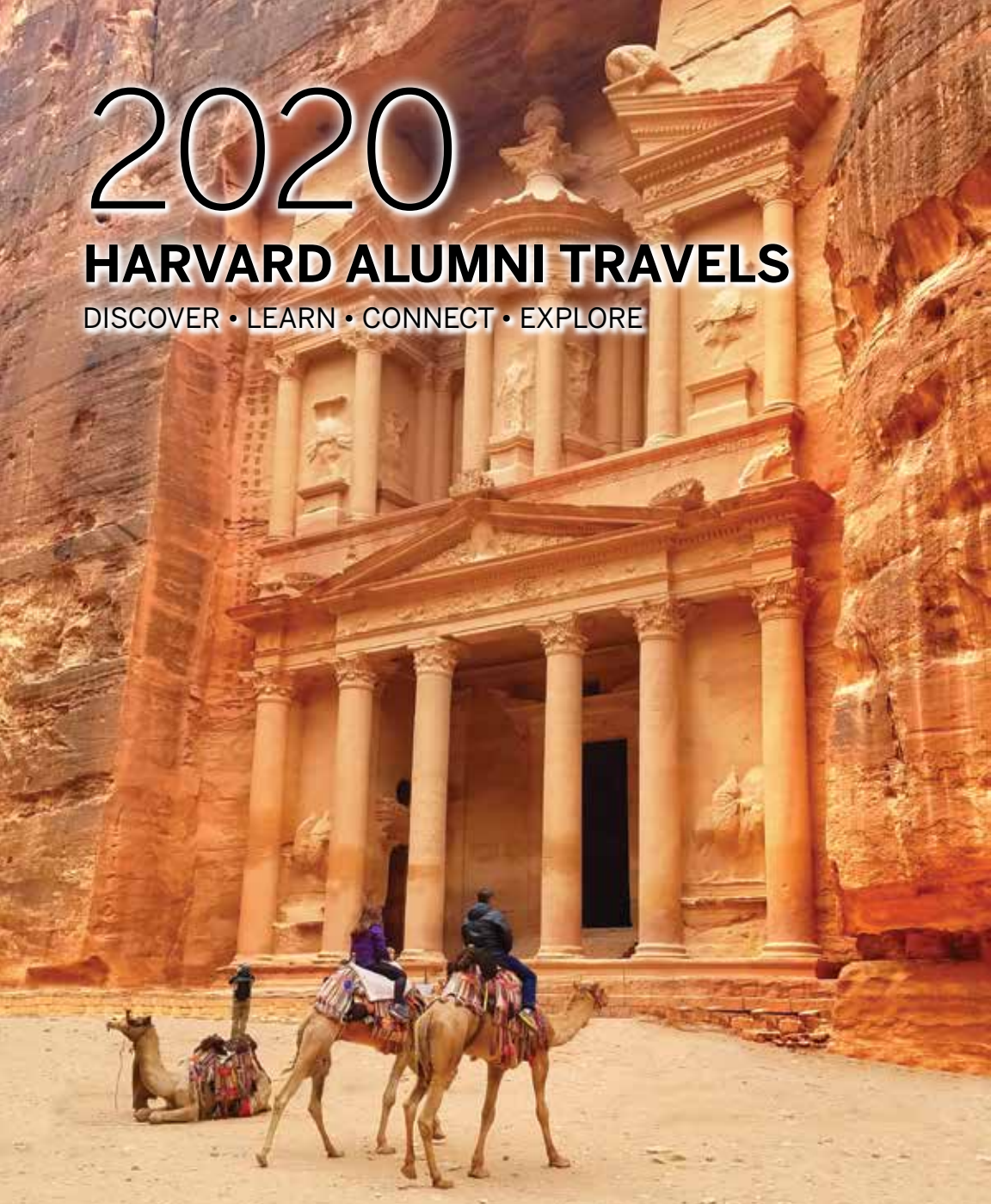

Study Leader



Michael McCormick, historian and archaeologist of the late Roman Empire and early medieval Europe, is Francis Golet Professor of Medieval

History at Harvard University. He has authored a prize-winning monograph on the transformations of Mediterranean shipping and communications networks in Roman and medieval times: *Origins of the European Economy* (2002) and, most recently, *Charlemagne's Survey of the Holy Land* (2011). As lead author, he has recently published the first multi-proxy scientific and historical reconstruction of climate under the Roman Empire, and is leading a new international project to recover ancient and medieval environmental data from an ice core. He is senior editor of the Digital Atlas of Roman and Medieval Civilizations, a free, online atlas used by specialists and amateurs around the world. He currently codirects the excavation of a late Roman settlement in eastern France and chairs the Initiative for the Science of the Human Past, a new Harvard network that brings together colleagues and students from across the University to explore scientific approaches to the past. Harvard College undergraduates and alumni prize his dedication to lively teaching inspired by pioneering research.

Schedule by Day

TUESDAY AND WEDNESDAY,
MAY 5 AND 6

U.S./Amman, Jordan

Depart the U.S. for Amman. Upon arrival, check into the five-star, centrally located FAIRMONT AMMAN.

THURSDAY, MAY 7

Amman

In vibrant Amman, visit the beautiful, blue-domed King Abdullah Mosque, built in 1989. Proceed to Amman's hilltop Citadel to explore the ruins of the Temple of Hercules and gain spectacular views of the city's skyline. See the three-tiered Roman Amphitheater, one of the largest in the Middle East. Explore the Jordan Museum, where the Neolithic plaster statues of 'Ain Ghazal are preserved. Attend the Welcome Reception in the hotel and enjoy dinner at leisure. (B,R)

FRIDAY, MAY 8

Amman/Jerash/Amman

In Jerash, Jordan's most captivating Greco-Roman site, the remarkably preserved colonnaded avenues, ceremonial gates, and golden-hued temples stand in testimony to one of the most important cities of the Roman Decapolis. Marvel at the impressive, three-gated Hadrian's Arch and walk the Sacred Way to the Temple of Artemis to admire the elaborately carved Corinthian columns. Take in the immensity

and the spectacular architecture of the Forum and the 56 soaring Ionic columns enclosing the oval plaza. See the Temple of Zeus and note the intricately decorated friezes. After lunch at a restaurant in Jerash, enjoy time for individual pursuits in Amman; dinner is at leisure. (B,L)

SATURDAY, MAY 9

Amman/Wadi Rum/Petra

Depart Amman and traverse the dramatic beauty and awe-inspiring wilderness of UNESCO World Heritage-designated Wadi Rum, known as the Valley of the Moon, where millennia of desert wind has carved a deep valley through towering granite and created spectacular sandstone formations. Embark on a Bedouin jeep ride through scenic canyons amid soaring mountains, undulating sand dunes, and rocky caverns etched with prehistoric inscriptions. Transfer to Petra and check into the MÖVENPICK PETRA, ideally located adjacent to the site's entrance. (B,L,D)

SUNDAY, MAY 10

Petra/Aqaba

Become mesmerized by the ancient "rose-red city" of Petra, a UNESCO World Heritage site and one of the New Seven Wonders of the World. Petra's majestic ensemble of temples, dwellings, and tombs, hewed from sandstone, holds a unique magnetism. Enter Petra through the narrow gorge known as

the Siq, with its serpentine path and towering walls leading climactically to the spellbinding Khazneh (Treasury).

Transfer to Aqaba and embark LE BOUGAINVILLE. Join the Captain's Welcome Reception and enjoy dinner while cruising the Red Sea. (B,L,R,D)

MONDAY, MAY 11

Hurghada, Egypt, for Luxor

Disembark the ship and travel through scenic mountains before descending into the lush Nile Valley. Arrive in Luxor and check into a Nile-view room in the STEIGENBERGER NILE PALACE HOTEL. Begin your exploration of the UNESCO World Heritage-designated Ancient Thebes with a visit to Karnak Temple, one of the largest religious structures ever built. This vast complex covers more than 100 acres and 2,000 years of history. Admire the exquisite craftsmanship of the statues of King Ramses II. Walk along the dramatic "Avenue of the Sphinxes." Continue to the Temple of Luxor and view the temple's fascinating bas reliefs depicting scenes from pharaonic times. (B,L,D)

TUESDAY, MAY 12

Luxor/Hurghada

Check out of the hotel and cruise across the Nile to the West Bank by motorboat. Framed by arid Theban hills, the sheer scale of the UNESCO World Heritage-designated Necropolis

is displayed throughout memorial temples built to ready each pharaoh for the next world. Descend the narrow passageways to the burial chamber of King Ramses IV and arrive at the tomb of the world's most famous pharaoh, King Tutankhamen. Continue to the Valley of the Queens for a specially arranged visit to the best preserved, most lavish Egyptian burial site, Queen Nefertari's tomb, where the beauty of King Ramses II's favorite queen is captured. Transfer to the ship for dinner this evening. (B,L,D)

WEDNESDAY, MAY 13 **Ain Sokhna for Giza**

The Great Pyramids of Cheops, Chephren, and Mycerinus, riveting symbols of Egypt's glory, are the only remaining Wonder of the Ancient World and now a UNESCO World Heritage site. Enjoy spectacular views of the mysterious Sphinx set against

a backdrop of the Pyramids it stoically guards. Visit the Solar Boat Museum at the foot of the Pyramids to see Pharaoh Khufu's reassembled funerary vessel. (B,L,D)

THURSDAY, MAY 14 **Suez Canal Transit**

Transit the iconic and integral 120-mile-long Suez Canal. (B,L,D)

FRIDAY, MAY 15 **Alexandria or Cairo**

Arrive in Alexandria and choose between a tour of the city or the UNESCO World Heritage site of Historic Cairo.

See the Library of Alexandria's visionary reincarnation, built in 2002. Trace the city's history at Alexandria's National Museum, home to a beautifully curated collection of artifacts. Visit the Catacombs of Kom El Shoqafa, Egypt's largest Roman burial structure. Explore Qaitbey Fort,

constructed on top of the remains of Lighthouse of Alexandria in 1480.

Or, experience the grandeur of Historic Cairo and the Egyptian Museum, preserving Old, Middle, and New Kingdom artifacts, including the entire repository of treasures from boy-king Tutankhamen's tomb. Egypt's 14th-century Golden Age is reflected in the elegant Sultan Hassan Mosque. (B,L,D)

SATURDAY, MAY 16 **Cruising the Mediterranean Sea**

Enjoy a day of cruising on the azure Mediterranean Sea. (B,L,D)

SUNDAY, MAY 17 **Santorini, Greece**

Be on deck as the ship cruises into picture-perfect Santorini. Tour the remarkable Bronze Age ruins of Akrotiri, held intact by layers of pumice and ash for over 3,500 years. Visit the Museum of
