Accompanied by the ship's expert team of naturalists, board sturdy Zodiac watercraft for excursions ashore and to observe Antarctica's abundant marine wildlife. Spend one night in cosmopolitan Buenos Aires, Argentina. Extend your journey with the Buenos Aires Pre-Program and Iguazú Falls Post Program Options.

Activity Level 3: 

A LITTLE MORE TO IT

This is an expedition-type cruise involving shore landings by rubber Zodiac boats. Participants must be able to get in and out of the Zodiacs with minimal assistance. While ashore in Antarctica, the excursions involve a fair amount of walking over rocky, uneven, and sometimes steep terrain. Please be aware that crossing the Drake Passage can be rough and unpredictable. Because of the remoteness of the destination and an absence of shore-side facilities for medical treatment, each participant must have a health statement signed by a physician verifying they are in very good physical condition in order to participate.

Study Leaders



Elsie M. Sunderland is the Gordon McKay Professor of Environmental Chemistry at the

Harvard John A. Paulson School of Engineering and Applied Sciences and in the Department of Environmental Health in the Harvard School of Public Health. She is a faculty associate in the Harvard University Center for the Environment and the Harvard Center for Risk Analysis, and the Department of Earth and Planetary Sciences. Her research focuses on how biogeochemical processes affect the fate, transport, and food web bioaccumulation of trace metals and organic chemicals. She is currently developing models at a variety of scales, ranging from ecosystems to global applications, to help characterize the impacts of past and future changes in climate and environmental releases of contaminants on human and ecological health. Her lecture topics will be announced closer to departure.

Arrive in cosmopolitan Buenos Aires and check into the five-star INTERCONTINENTAL BUENOS AIRES HOTEL, ideally located within walking distance of the landmark Palace of the Argentine National Congress.

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 29

Buenos Aires/Ushuaia

This morning, fly to Ushuaia, the world's southernmost city, capital of Tierra del Fuego and the gateway to Antarctica. Embark L' AUSTRAL this afternoon and cruise through storied Beagle Channel, named for the ship that carried Charles Darwin on his South American voyages.

Attend the Captain's Welcome Reception this evening. (B,R,D)

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 30

Cruising the Drake Passage

Cross the legendary Drake Passage and, upon reaching the Antarctic Convergence, watch for seabirds and

breaching humpback whales feeding on plankton and krill brought to the surface by cold Antarctic currents merging with the warmer waters of the South Pacific and Atlantic Oceans. Your expedition team of naturalists will present insightful lectures, preparing you for your first landing in Antarctica. During the evening, enjoy the lingering twilight of the Antarctic summer. (B,L,D)

Please note that the ship's cruising pattern and positionings are dependent on weather, ice and sea conditions and are subject to change.

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 1 TO

TUESDAY, DECEMBER 7

Cruising Antarctica

Cruise below the 60th parallel south to the outer shores and islands of the Antarctic Peninsula. Explore some of the Earth's most pristine wilderness, an otherworldly topography featuring towering mountains of ice and volcanic rock, precipitous coastlines and ever-changing patterns of ice stretching toward the boundless blue horizon. In this seemingly harsh environment, a vast array of marine life flourishes, including millions of penguins, countless seabirds, and thousands of seals and whales. Covered in a thick, vertical ice sheet populated with

riveting wildlife and dotted with historic touchstones, "The White Continent" unfolds, immersing you in world's most inaccessible continent.

Visit **King George Island**, home to numerous international research stations. The largest of 20 ruggedly beautiful volcanic islands that comprise the South Shetland Islands, King George offers a spellbinding preamble to the continent's rich wildlife. Cruise in Zodiacs and be on the lookout for orcas and view gregarious colonies of Adélie, chinstrap and gentoo penguins set against the surreal backdrop of wind sculpted icebergs the size of galleons.

In the outer recesses of the South Shetland Islands, **Elephant Island** of Sheckleton fame is named for the abundance of highly social southern elephant seals, the world's largest seal.

Survey the waters for fin, sei and humpback whales as you cruise north to the ice-covered expanses of **Coronation Island**, the largest of the South Orkney Islands. In this harsh, eco-tundra region, observe downy snow petrels flaunting their canny ability to run on water and athletic Adélie penguins known to waddle or belly-toboggan across 50 miles of ice to reach their breeding site. Encounter a natural silence, broken only by

Weddell Sea pack ice.



Watch for theatrical humpback whales, known to spy-hop, breach, roll and fluke within feet of passing Zodiacs.

the white thunder of calving glaciers and the babble of seals and chattering penguins.

Prepare to experience one of the planet's most humbling and momentous cosmic events as our vessel cruises to position itself in the full shadow of the moon during the **total solar eclipse**.

Please note that optimal viewing is dependent on weather and sea conditions.

Discovered in 1842 by British explorer James Clark Ross, **Heroína Island** is located at the tip of the Antarctic peninsula. This island is one of the Danger Islands, where a previously unknown super colony of 1.5 million Adélie penguins was detected by satellite imaging in 2018.

Celebrate your first continental landing 126 years after Norwegian Carsten Borchgrevink made the first confirmed landing on the Antarctic mainland. Explore **Brown Bluff**,

an extinct volcano named for the craggy red-brown tuff cliff that rises steeply from a pebble seafront populated with thriving populations of Weddell and leopard seals and over 20,000 pairs of nesting Adélie penguins. Make your second continental landing at the **Bernardo O'Higgins Base**, named for the revered Chilean Independence leader.

Formed by the rim of a dormant volcanic crater, **Deception Island** encircles the Port Foster caldera. The ship enters through Neptune's Bellows, a sublime harbor ringed by snowcapped peaks and sheer cliffs. In Pendulum Cove, see steaming, geothermally heated shallows. Walk along the black-sand beach of Telefon Bay to nearby craters for firsthand insight into the pivotal volcanic activity that created this island and shaped the natural history of the region. (7B,7L,7D)

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 8

Cruising the Drake Passage/ Ushuaia, Argentina

Cross the Drake Passage and enjoy lively, informative discussions with the ship's naturalists. Watch for migrating albatross, hourglass dolphins and the many different species of petrels as you cruise across the Antarctic Convergence. (B,L,D)

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 9

Ushuaia/Buenos Aires

Disembark in Ushuaia and fly to Buenos Aires. Continue on the Iguazú Falls Post-Program Option with an overnight stay in Buenos Aires or depart for the U.S. (B)

Total Solar Eclipse

For millennia, the experience of a total eclipse of the sun has elicited awe and deep emotion. On December 4, 2021, at 3:06 a.m. local time, enjoy an optimal viewing opportunity as Antarctica falls into darkness from the new moon passing between the Earth and the sun. The path of this extraordinary total solar eclipse will travel from east to west, a phenomenon that is unique to polar regions. Shifting light, plummeting temperatures, stirring winds and perplexed creatures will signal a rare cosmic event that will not occur again in the Antarctic region until the year 2396. For one minute and 38 seconds, the black disk of the moon will cover the sun as Bailey's beads gives way to the dazzling diamond ring of the solar corona.

PLEASE NOTE: While the eclipse itself is guaranteed, the viewing of the eclipse is dependent on the conditions of the weather and the sea. Expedition staff will do everything they can to ensure an optimal viewing experience but cannot jeopardize the safety of passengers or the return schedule of the ship.

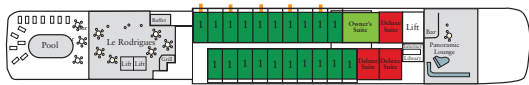
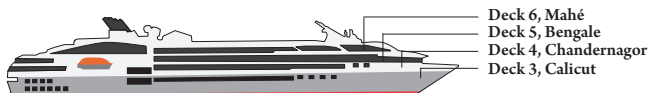

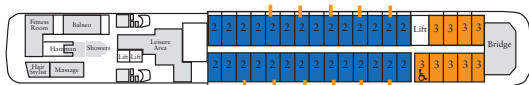
