Generally, the river safaris and game drives are not physically demanding, and participation in these activities is optional and at your discretion. Excursions may involve some walking over stone floors, brick streets, or uneven terrain, and may require climbing stairs. You must be able to step into and out of safari vehicles and excursion boats alone or with minimal assistance from your travel companion. The itinerary involves long, bumpy drives over very rough, dusty terrain. This program also includes several flights, and you must be able to go up and down stairs to board and deplane the airplanes. South Africa, Botswana, Namibia, and Zimbabwe are located in a malaria zone. It is strongly recommended that you discuss this risk with your personal physician immediately to determine your need for an anti-malaria regimen no later than four months prior to departure.

Study Leaders



Bence P. Ölveczky is a Professor of Organismic and **Evolutionary Biology** at Harvard University. He holds a PhD in

Neuroscience from Harvard and heads a lab studying the neural circuit mechanisms that underlie different aspects of motor skill learning and execution. He has received several awards, including the McKnight and Klingenstein Fellowships. He lives in Cambridge, Massachusetts, with his wife Daniele and their three young children, Oscar, Eva, and Camilla.

Professor Ölveczky plans to lecture on animal migration, collective intelligence in animal groups, and signals and communication in animals. He will talk about the evolutionary and mechanistic explanation of these phenomenon in general as well as some recent research that is advancing understanding of these topics.

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Schedule by Day

SATURDAY, MARCH 11 AND SUNDAY, MARCH 12

U.S./ Johannesburg, South Africa

Depart the U.S. and arrive the next day in cosmopolitan Johannesburg, known colloquially as "Joburg," and check into the five-star Fairlawns Boutique Hotel & Spa.

MONDAY, MARCH 13

Johannesburg for Pretoria

North of Johannesburg, vibrant Pretoria is South Africa's administrative capital, known for its distinctly *Afrikaans* culture, stunning architecture, and ubiquitous purple-blossomed jacaranda trees.

Visit the monolithic Voortrekker Monument, honoring the mid-19th century Dutch voortrekkers (pioneers) who migrated from the British-controlled Cape Colony to the inland Highveld region. See the sandstone Union Buildings and the formal garden where Nelson Mandela delivered his historic presidential inauguration speech in 1994. Attend the Captain's Welcome Reception and Dinner. (B,L,R,D)

TUESDAY, MARCH 14

Johannesburg for Soweto

Follow in the footsteps of Nobel Peace Prize

South Africa's 21st-century journey to democracy, and gain insight into the realities of township life through powerful artifacts, photographs, and film footage. (B,L)

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 15

Johannesburg/ Victoria Falls

Arrive in Victoria Falls and check into the elegant and historic Victoria Falls Hotel. (B,D)



Admire picturesque Cape Dutch architecture and taste acclaimed wine at the historical Vergelegen Estate.

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 16

Victoria Falls

Walk the jungle-fringed trail along the edge of UNESCO-inscribed Victoria Falls, one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World. Here, the Zambezi River plunges

into a narrow, 360-foot gorge—twice the height of Niagara Falls—creating frothy rapids and vaulting a colorful mist into the air. (B)

FRIDAY, MARCH 17

Victoria Falls/ Kasane, Botswana/ Namibia

Watch for elephants, wild dogs, zebras, and giraffes on a game drive in Chobe National Park. In the afternoon, embark the ZAMBEZI QUEEN, a five-star river boat, to prepare for your cruise along the Chobe River. (B,L,D)

SATURDAY, MARCH 18 AND SUNDAY, MARCH 19

Cruising the Chobe River

Enjoy up-close views of wildlife, including elephant, giraffe, kudu, oryx, and an astounding array of bird species. Discover the unique symbiosis between species such as the Oxpecker and Cape buffalo in this unspoiled ecosystem.

Expert local guides will lead game-viewing river safaris aboard small excursion boats.(2B,2L,2D)

MONDAY, MARCH 20

Kasane/Cape Town, South Africa

Disembark the river boat in Kasane and transfer to the airport. Fly to Cape Town, South Africa, and check into the iconic, five-star Belmond Mount

TUESDAY, MARCH 21

Cape Town/ Table Mountain/ Robben Island

Enjoy a cable car ride to

the top of Table Mountain for spectacular views, followed by a scenic drive through the city and view the Bo-Kaap and District Six area.

Robben Island, a UNESCO
World Heritage site,
where Mandela and
other political prisoners
made strides during
apartheid. The prison's
storied interior and its
guides—former prisoners,
many of whom served
with Mandela—provide an
invaluable perspective on
South Africa's social and
political transformation.(B)

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 22

Cape Town/ Cape Point

Experience a panoramic drive to Cape Point, visit an African Penguin Colony on Boulders Beach, and journey to Cape Point, a nature reserve within the Table Mountain National Park. Take the FLYING DUTCHMAN FUNICULAR for incredible views over the Cape of Good Hope. (B,L)

THURSDAY, MARCH 23

Cape Town/ Cape Winelands

Cape Town/ MalaMala Private Game Reserve

International Airport for your flight to Skukuza. Arrive at the MalaMala Private Game Reserve and check into your lodge. Enjoy a safari game drive this afternoon. (B,D)

MalaMala Private Game Reserve/ Johannesburg/U.S.

After an early morning game drive and breakfast, check out of the lodge and transfer to Tambo Airport in Johannesburg for your return flight to the U.S., which arrives the next day. (B)



The Zambezi Queen was named the World's Leading Boutique Cruise by the World Travel Awards in 2021. Each of the 14 tastefully appointed, spacious, air-conditioned staterooms features expansive sliding glass doors that open onto a private balcony, one queen bed or two twin beds, and private bathroom with shower.

Regional cuisine is prepared by the South African-trained culinary staff with fresh, local ingredients and an international flair; the spacious dining room has windows on threesides for optimal game viewing as animals gather at the water's edge.
